



Our Camaro is an all original 1969 Camaro Super Sport 396, numbers matching, 396/325 HP Engine, Factory 4 Speed M22 Muncie Transmission (Hurst shifter), 12 bolt Posi Rear Axle, Factory X22 Code Big Block, Original Color Code 57 Fathom Green, Green Vniyl Top, Green Standard Interior, Factory Tach, Console, and Gauge package, working Center Clock, Correct Spare and Jack Assembly, Rally Wheels with Wide Oval Tires, Original T3 Headlights, Front and Rear Spoilers, 44,000 original miles. It has stock dual exhaust with cross-flow muffler system. It has a Rochester Quadrajet 4 barrel carburetor that was rebuilt by an AACA Senior Judge.
